School Closures Continue

Secondary schools and colleges are to provide limited face-to-face tutorials for small groups of students taking exams next year; current Year 10 and Year 12.

All other year groups continue with home learning.



This week was very exciting as, finally- we were able to celebrate the opening of Cleeve Meadow School on the Cleeve Park site.

Cleeve Meadow School has been designed to provide specialist education for 120 pupils aged 11-19 with moderate learning difficulties. The new school will be managed by The Kennal Academies Trust (TKAT) part of its family of 45 Academies across London and the South of England.

Executive Head teacher Mrs Tyler-Maher officially took possession of the keys to the new building from Project Manager David McPherson,

on behalf of the construction team at Galford Try.

The new free school has 12 teaching rooms, a therapeutic hub, large open plan library and IT space. Facilities also include a specialist music department, performing arts centre and a full-sized artificial football pitch that will also be available for Cleeve Park School pupils to use.

Existing and new pupils will be welcomed from September 2020, once all the IT facilities and furniture are installed.
