The KS3 Achievement Awards



Well done again to all our students—if you didn't win an award this term, don't be disappointed. By logging onto Google Classrooms over the summer and completing the work set, you will be in a strong position to be nominated for an award from your Head of Year in the Autumn term.

If you aren't sure how to use Google Classrooms, please check your emails as your log-in details— and videos that show you how to access and submit work -have already been sent to you.

You can also follow the steps below...

1 Go to Google.com. Click the sign in button in the top right

2 Enter your Google Classroom username and password then click next. Your login details were sent to your school email

3 Click the nine dots in the top right then select Classroom. You will now see all your classes on Google Classroom.

4 Choose a class, then click classwork at the top. Click the lessons to view a video or PPT. When you have gone through all 3 lessons select the task, Click view assignment at the bottom

5 When the task opens, read the instructions carefully, then click on the worksheet/link/PowerPoint/quiz. If it is a worksheet or PowerPoint, click the 'Open with' button at the top and select either Google Slides or Google Docs to be able to write on it. Complete the task and when finished, close the tab. It saves automatically

6 To submit the work, click the 'Add or create' button, then select Google Drive. When you see the pop up appear, select the first file in the top left and then click Add. Click the hand in button to submit work. If you have anything else to say, use the Private comment box below to submit additional comments to your teacher
