Sixth Form Psychology trip to the Freud Museum



During September Mr Scott, Miss O'Hare and 24 sixth formers visited the final home of Sigmund Freud, the founder of psychoanalysis, in North London.

Freud fortunately, as a Jew, escaped the Nazi takeover of Vienna in 1939 and settled here. We were able to see the famous couch where he would encourage patients to reveal their deepest and darkest unconscious thoughts, the room where he died, walk all around his house, we saw everything from a Dali portrait of Freud hanging on a wall to one of the clothes pegs Freud used to keep his mouth open so he could carry on smoking his beloved cigars even as he lay dying of mouth cancer.

We then had a brilliant but amusing talk by a practising Psychoanalyst who was able to show how Freud's ideas, so often ridiculed today, are still so relevant. The students were a credit to the school and showed real resilience getting to the venue in the face of train and tube chaos.

A good time was had by all and Mr Scott feels much better after his time on the couch and telling Stanley all about his childhood.

Once logged in, you are able to view your child's timetable, monitor attendance and view student reports. It also enables you to update any contact details and see the information and consents


we hold for your child.
